STATE any misconceptions about it.

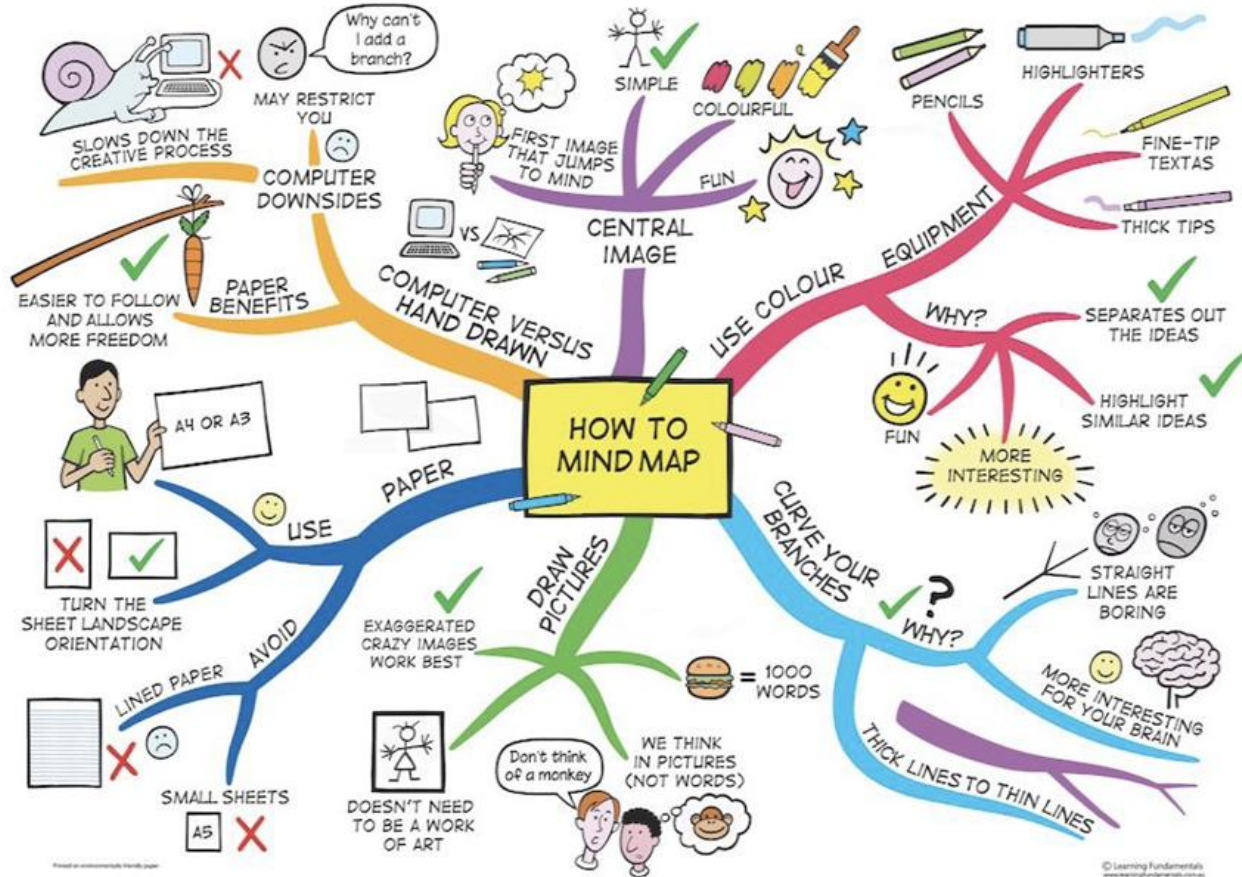
Lose it?

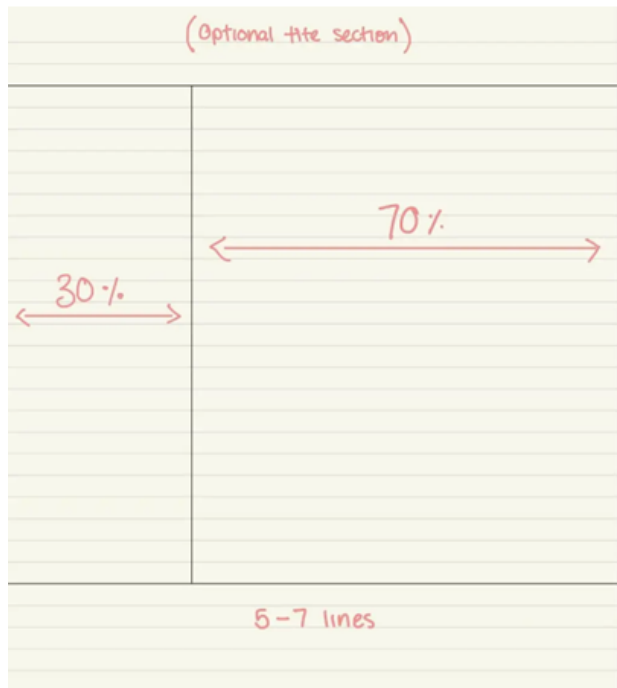


# Revision - Mind Map
